GETTING STARTED

It's easy to get the ball rolling. If there is a postmember who already holds an FCC license as a radio amateur, ask him or her to check out The American Legion Amateur Radio Club. Established

by the National Executive Committee Resolution No. 11 in May 2011, the club has a website at www.legion.org/hamradio with complete details. Membership is open to all members in good standing of The American Legion, the American Legion Auxiliary, Sons of The American Legion and Legion Riders who hold valid FCC amateur radio licenses. There is no fee for joining TALARC. Your licensed member can evaluate the best way for your post to get involved based on a variety of factors and provide your post commander and executive committee with recommendations. Activities can range from something as simple as conducting an amateur radio licensing class to putting in a ham radio station at the post and even starting a post radio group. While this activity might not be suitable for every post, those that have become involved have enjoyed an increased growth in membership, good media coverage and participation by young people that translates into the full range of Legion youth programs.

In respect of my currant Sub Veterans at American Legion 639, here is a piece of history that possibly prolonged my survival during the "Battle of Midway"

4 June 1942.

USS Tambor

"Lt. Cmdr. John W. "Spuds" Murphy, commanding the submarine *Tambor*, had been in command of that boat since the start of the war; *Tambor* had made two war patrols. During the mid watch on 5 June 1942, ignorant of the location of friendly forces, Murphy spotted four ships, at night, on the horizon, haul down. At periscope depth, Murphy moved closer.

Twice he attempted this maneuver until at the third surfacing and still unable to ID the ships sighted, he called his signal man topside to send the following lamp message, "Identify yourselves", As Murphy and the Japanese soon realized, the *Tambor* was in the middle of the Japanese fleet.

Two heavy cruiser and supporting ships began evasive maneuverings. the heavy cruisers *Mikuma* and the *Mogami* began turns at flank, each made a fatal turn. Consequently, Mogami, T-boned her sister cruiser amidships, in their haste to escape the presence of the *Tambor*.

One of the cruisers was later sunk on 6 June. Unknown at the time till my research of the Japans fleet maneuvers, these two Japanese Cruisers were headed to the south east location of Sand Island to bombard the shore line for the Japanese landing force of 5,000 the next night.

This was the location of my machine bunker. The bunker is still preserved, for historians and I to visit on anniversary dates.

As of 2012, there are only two of us Midway Island Marines as survivors that can be located.
